From the Executive Director

We are blessed to be one of our community's most treasured nonprofits. I cannot help but be proud that our reputation has spanned over 10 decades, garnering respect and serving a critical role in meeting the needs of seniors. Being recognized by the CDA Regional Chamber with the "Nonprofit of the Year Award" was one of the many highlights of last year. Over 10,000 people every day in the U.S. turn 70, more than at any other time in history. And the need for senior living and the socialization and care we provide will never be greater. But with those opportunities we are faced with rising pressures stemming from significant workforce shortages and inflated costs. Over the past 2 years, we have experienced on average a 12% increase in wages. Without a strong staff, we would not function, and their work needs to be encouraged.

In 2022, we received over 250 inquiries from people searching for charitable care at our assisted living. Likewise, at our HUD-subsidized apartments, the wait list is now 1 to 5 years long. In addition, we receive numerous requests for apartments for couples and for those who do not meet the low-income requirements but who desire to live on our campus.

As we look to future growth, we will continue to empower older adults to live as independently as possible and when this becomes a challenge, we will be there to help meet their needs. It was the foundation of our ministry 102 years ago and remains the same today and in future tomorrows.




Operational Revenue \$3,904,164




Operational Expenses \$3,976,217

Update-Assisted Living/Memory Care

Average resident:

- 88 years old
- Female
- Has dementia or Alzheimer's
- Needs help with most Activities of Daily Living
- Average stay in Assisted Living: 13 months
- Average stay in Memory Care: 11 months
- Received calls from 241 requesting charitable care
- Supported 26 residents with our charitable care
- 71,715 meals served
- 12.045 meals delivered
- Churches engaged in volunteering went from 10 to 15
- Individual volunteers went from 14 to 33
